

ERASMUS MUNDUS Promotion of European Higher Education – Action 3

Projects related to ASIA

One of the priorities of the Erasmus Mundus Action 3 annual calls for proposals in the framework of the second phase of the programme (2009-2013) is to support projects that aim at **promoting European higher education in specific geographical areas**. These geographic areas may be related to countries or groups of countries that have international student flows or countries that are less represented in international cooperation programmes in higher education.

Action 3 projects may involve large and versatile partnerships grouping several countries from different regions or focusing on specific regions or sub regions of the same geographical territory. The international dimension of Action 3 projects is crucial to their success and the valorisation of their outcomes. Thus, the projects listed below are related to the geographical area of **Asia** but may concern a variety of themes or academic disciplines.

HEIP-LINK is focused to develop an interactive on-line information platform which provides the most updated information on R&D collaboration framework aspects.

This 3 years project aims to contribute to increasing attractiveness of European higher education in the Asian part of the Russian Federation. More specifically the project aims at **creating joint education bodies** (joint faculties and institutes) which will provide education corresponding to the maximal possible extend to the European model. In addition, in the framework of this project the **Siberian Centre of European Education (SCEE)** will be established and will bring together universities of Siberia and Europe for sharing and spreading European experience in the sphere of higher education on the territory of Siberia, the Urals and the Far East of the Russian Federation.

ASEMUNDUS is a 3 year initiative of 9 Erasmus Mundus National Structures that seeks to enhance higher education cooperation and especially university mobility between the EU and Asia. During this period three Asian countries were selected and visited by members of the ASEMUNDUS consortium in order to attend higher education fairs and organise networking seminars linked to the fairs.

The project aims to:

- enhance the **visibility and attractiveness** of the European Higher Education Area and Erasmus Mundus within Asian ASEM member states;
- enhance the **participation** of Asian higher education institutions within new and/or existing Erasmus Mundus joint programmes;
- facilitate and strengthen **institutional cooperation** between higher education institutions from the EU and Asia.

ASEMUNDUS actively participated in three higher education fairs in three different Asian ASEM countries to enhance the visibility and general awareness of Erasmus Mundus in targeted Asian ASEM countries.

ASEMUNDUS has organized thematic contact seminars parallel to each fair attendance, in order to help facilitate and strengthen cooperation and increase the number of Erasmus Mundus partnerships between the European and Asian Higher Education Institutions. The seminars focussed on relevant topics for the ASEM educational process and informed about Erasmus Mundus.

An important outcome of the experiences gained during the project is a **Good Practice Report**.

CODOC is a 2 years project provides occasions for dialogue and networking so as to **foster stronger doctoral education partnerships between Europe, Asia, Africa and Latin America**. The activities promote **collaborative doctoral education** as a key element of quality and attractiveness and enhance the international visibility of European doctoral education. The targets group are leaders of doctoral schools in the four regions but the outcomes are disseminated to a wider pool of higher education stakeholders, ranging from governments to research councils to donors.
