What is D&E?

- **Dissemination** is a **planned process** of providing **information** on the **results** of programmes and initiatives to key actors. It occurs as and when the results of programmes and initiatives become available.
- **Exploitation** is:
 - (a) a **planned process of transferring the successful results** of the programmes and initiatives to appropriate **decision-makers** in regulated local, regional, national or European systems, on the one hand, and
 - (b) a planned process of **convincing individual end-users to adopt and/or apply the results** of programmes and initiatives, on the other hand.

Summary

This two year, 120 ECTS Master's Course provides a top quality and broad multidisciplinary education in the emerging field of nanoscience and nanotechnology, coupled with an individual top-level specialization in one of five defined areas of nanoscience and nanotechnology: nanophysics, nanochemistry, nanoelectronics, biophysics or nanobiotechnology. The Course is organized by the Katholieke Universiteit Leuven (Belgium), Chalmers Tekniska Högskola, Göteborg (Sweden), Technische Universität Dresden (Germany) and the Joseph Fourier Université de Grenoble (France). The course aims to instil in its students the power to work, communicate and think across the boundaries of traditional scientific disciplines.

The course is organized with the support of three associated partners: IMEC in Leuven (Belgium), CEA-LETI in Grenoble (France) and Leibniz Institute for Solid State Materials Research in Dresden (Germany). These institutes are providing access to world class infrastructure for Nanotechnology research and development and opportunities for graduating students to continue their study with a PhD.

The consortium offers a highly integrated programme, based on a jointly developed curriculum and composed of course modules that are fully recognized by all consortium partners. All students start the first year at the KU Leuven, where they follow a set of introductory courses to give them a common starting

Closing the gender gap in voluntary service projects

Across the world, we are moving closer to achieving equality between men and women. One European project travelled to East Africa to work with voluntary organisations there, hoping to lessen the gender divide

JAMBO aimed to empower youth social workers (both male and female), providing them with new tools to encourage more female participation in local community and international voluntary service projects.

Project Co-ordinator Sara Mandozzi explained the many ways in which the project has helped people so far:

JAMBO allowed participants to develop a new awareness of gender issues and the importance of promoting equality, to gain more exposure, to acquire new skills to apply in their personal life and in their activities and projects.

The project also helped to build relationships between voluntary organisations in Europe and East Africa, creating some wide-reaching networks that will benefit many others in the future.

The partners, including charity and volunteering specialists, worked with hundreds of participants in women's groups, children's centres, youth groups and anti-AIDS organisations in Kenya, Uganda and Tanzania. They researched gender issues and the role of women, focusing on family, economy and community, and compared European and East African societal roles.

JAMBO ran training courses and developed non-formal education methods which were then used in youth meetings across all three African countries. The sessions involved hundreds of young people and many local organisations, who then shared their knowledge and created new networks. The partners produced a toolkit that will continue to be used at meetings, study groups and training sessions across the world.

Organisations involved with JAMBO have benefited from working with each other at a national level, and the voluntary project workers who participated say they have enjoyed approaching gender issues from a wider perspective.

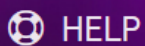

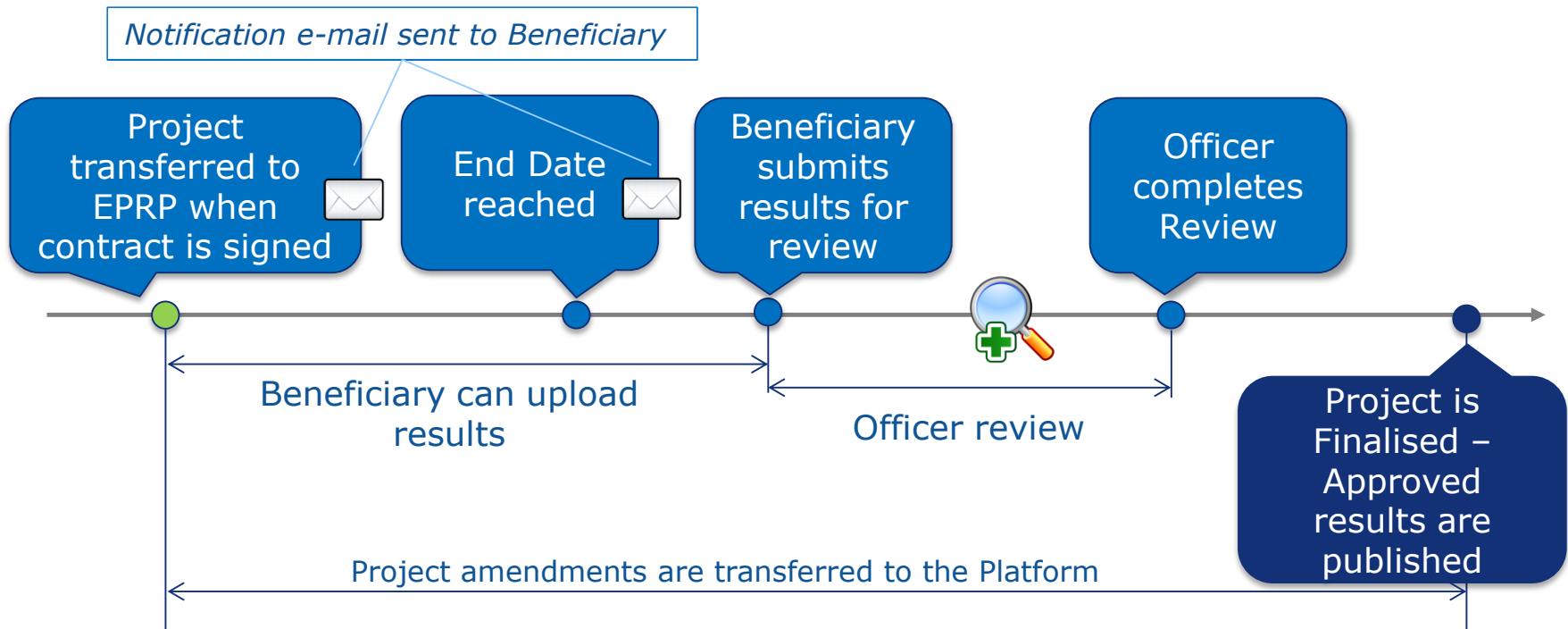
